


Book Discussions

April 11: The Woman King (2022).

Movie Synopsis: In the late eighteenth century, the Kingdom of Dahomey flourished as one of Africa's most powerful states. Yet as European merchants encroach, seeking riches at the expense of its people, warrior Nanisca takes a stand to uphold her peoples' freedom. Inspired by true events (Rating: PG-13, 2hr 15min).

April 18: The Big Sick (2017).

Movie Synopsis: A Pakistani-American stand-up comedian falls for a white grad student, and decides to keep their uncertain romance a secret from his traditionalist, Muslim family. However, their relationship gets more serious when she develops a mysterious illness, which in turn forces him to bond with her parents (Rating: R, 2hr).





April 25: Enjoy a presentation from Joe Fahey, called: "Tut's Tomb and the Valley of the Kings."
For 500 years royal mummies of the New Kingdom were interred in elaborate underground tombs in the Valley of the Kings.
