Tuesday, April 16 at 5pm

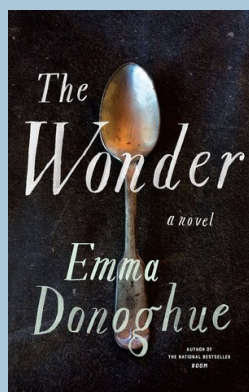
